

How do I log in to myHR as a former associate?

From the myHR home page, log in under the “Kohl’s Alumni” section, following the instructions below:

Note: *It is recommended to use Chrome as your internet browser when accessing myHR.*

- If you are a new user, select the *New User* button and fill out the appropriate sections
- If you do not know your user ID and/or password, select the *Forgot Password* button

For password reset and login assistance, follow the steps below:

1. Call the Service Center at **844-564-5747** and select option 1 for English or option 2 for Spanish
2. Select option 1 “For Benefits Information such as Enrollment, Eligibility, Rates and Life Events”
3. Say “Website Assistance and Password”


Your security is important to us

To log on to the website, you’ll need to set up a complex password that meets certain requirements.

You’ll also need to set up a separate personal identification number (PIN) to verify your identity when you call the Service Center at **844-564-5747**.

The process is easy and fast. Just follow the prompts when you log on to **myHR.kohls.com**.
